



Swiss Master Education System

The Swiss education system raises the world's best scientists with its strong educational approach. Switzerland is also one of the most preferred countries for graduate studies.

The postgraduate education system in Switzerland offers you a wide range of opportunities that you cannot imagine. Someone who wants to do a master's degree in Switzerland must attend programs that last for 3 or 4 semesters. In terms of credits, they need to take between 90 and 120 credits.

There are universities like the Berner Fachhochschule where you can study applied sciences, but you can also study marketing and finance at universities like the Graduate School of Business Administration.

Each canton in Switzerland has its own education system. For this reason, there may be some differences in course content between cantons.

Applying for a Master's Degree in Switzerland and Admission Requirements
If you want to pursue a master's degree in Switzerland, you are very lucky to have numerous job opportunities after graduation, as well as opportunities to work after school.

However, before you start studying for a master's degree in Switzerland, you need to have some technical knowledge about the Swiss master's application documents. Universities in Switzerland generally look highly on your diploma, GPA and foreign language proficiency. If you do not meet these requirements, it is very difficult to gain admission.

Documents required for a master's degree in Switzerland;

Your undergraduate diploma from the university you graduated from



Photocopy of identity card

Your GPA grade point average

A detailed transcript showing all your course grades

A recent language certificate in French, German, Italian or English

Receipt of payment of the university application fee

Two or three reference letters from academics related to your department

2 recent biometric photographs

Signed copy of the application form with a long clear signature

CV showing your internship and work experience if you are going to enroll in MBA programs

Portfolio if you intend to study a Swiss master's degree in fields such as architecture and graphic design.

All documents must be submitted to Swiss universities for translation by sworn translators according to your chosen language of study.

Language Requirements for Master's Degree in Switzerland

There are some language requirements and various exam requirements for participation in the Swiss Master's program, which will change your life in a positive way. Currently, there are 4 different native languages that are valid in Switzerland. These native languages are French, English, Italian, German and German, and they are also the basis for Swiss master's entrance exams.

To prove your proficiency in English, you need to take one of the IELTS or TOEFL exams. To prove your proficiency in French, you need to take one of the DELF, DALF or TCF exams. To prove your German language proficiency, you need to take one of the TestDAF or DSH exams.

To prove your Italian language proficiency, you need to take one of the CILS or ELIS exams.

Some Swiss universities only accept your language test results and transcripts as a requirement for your master's degree, while other schools may impose additional test requirements. For example, if you want to do a master's degree at one of the applied universities in Switzerland, you need to indicate your internship and workplaces.

In fields such as design and architecture, you will be expected to prepare a portfolio.
